Environmental and Planning Review: At A Glance

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires public agencies in the state of California to review development projects for environmental impacts before issuing permits. In this case, the City of Oakland has prepared an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and recommendations regarding project approval. Below is a summary of the process as it relates to the Head-Royce School Planned Unit Development Permit (PUD) Project, known informally as the South Campus Plan.

Study Period 2018 - Nov. 2021*

- ☑ The City of Oakland held a public scoping meeting to propose areas of study for the Head-Royce School Planned Unit Development Permit (PUD) Project EIR.
- The City prepared an EIR to study possible environmental impacts of the Head-Royce School Planned Unit Development Permit (PUD) Project Proposal.

Draft EIR and Public Comment Period

Nov. 2021 - Dec. 2021*

- ▼ The City published a Draft EIR (DEIR), available for public review.
- The City opened a public comment period on the DEIR.
- ▼ The Landmarks Preservation
 Advisory Board and Planning
 Commission received public
 comment on the DEIR. The public
 also provided comments in writing
 to the City.

Final EIR and Action on Project 2023*

- ★ The City responded to public comments as part of a Final EIR (FEIR).
- The Landmarks Preservation Advisory
 Board and Planning Commission held
 hearings and unanimously certified the
 EIR and approved the project.
- ☐ The City Council will hear a project appeal and render a final decision.
